Fall – 2020 Advising Process

Advising will be in three phases as always. The procedure is the same for all students including probation students. However, there are some notable points to note:

- 1. Pre-advising is mandatory for phase 1
- 2. Faculty evaluation is mandatory for phase 1
- 3. Most of the students will be advising from day 1 including probation 1 to 3
- 4. Probation 4 students having CGPA 1 or more will get another chance.
- 5. Probations 5 and above will be handled by the corresponding department separately.
- 6. Reasons for disqualification from advising:
 - Missing pre-advising
 - Payment is due
 - Missing faculty evaluation by the regular students with at least one course in summer 2020
 - > Student is absent for 2 or more consecutive semesters without permission.
 - Enrolled for more than 8 years.

Phase 1 - Pre-advised Based advising

- 1. Advising will be based on students' pre-advising selections.
- 2. Student can add, drop and section change
- 3. Every student will have two slots for the day.
- 4. Any student who is missing a slot can advise in phase 2 and in phase 3

Phase 2 - Slot less advising

- 1. No slot. Equal opportunity to everybody with possible queuing if number exceeds a limit.
- 2. Pre-advising restriction will be removed. All courses will be visible to all students
- 3. Student can add, drop and section change

Phase 3 - Drop less advising

- 1. The system will remain open for all students
- 2. Course drop is strictly prohibited.
- 3. Section change is allowed
- 4. Advising ends on 26th October 2020.
