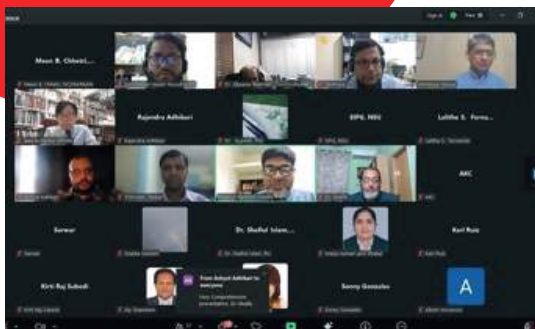
Professor Sk Tawfique M Haque

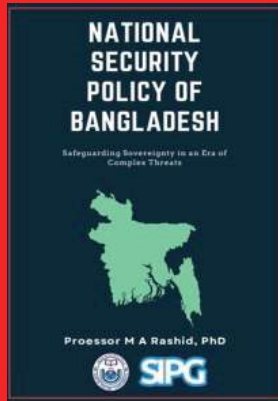
