CSCSS International Conference: "China - South Asia: Civilization and Connectivity: History and Contemporary Issues" (27-28 December 2024)

The International Conference on "China - South Asia: Civilization and Connectivity: History and Contemporary Issues" was held from 27 to 28 December 2024. It was jointly organized by the China–South Asia Center for Sociocultural Studies (CSCSS) of the South Asian Institute of Policy and Governance (SIPG) at North South University (NSU) in Bangladesh and Yunnan University in China.

The two-day conference featured diverse sessions on socio-cultural interactions, geopolitics, economic growth, media, education, AI, and health, with over 125 participants from academia, policymaking, and international organizations. It concluded successfully with rich discussions across key themes addressing the region's historical, cultural, geopolitical, and socio-economic aspects.

Student Roundtable Discussion on "গণ-অভ্যুত্থান ২০২৪: তরুণ প্রজন্মের প্রত্যাশায় আগামীর বাংলাদেশ" (19 August 2024)

SIPG of NSU hosted a pivotal roundtable discussion titled "গণ-অভ্যুত্থান ২০২৪: তরুণ প্রজন্মের প্রত্যাশায় আগামীর বাংলাদেশ" on Monday, August 19, 2024, at 11:00 AM. The event was live-streamed via the CPS's official Facebook page and brought together students from several prominent private universities who played a prominent role in the July 2024 mass uprising that led to the historic regime change in Bangladesh. During the discussion, students explored various aspects of national reformation and the country's future direction. They emphasized the role of private university students in shaping the political landscape and the paradigm shift that has occurred due to their active participation.



SIPG Hosts Policy Debate on the Future of Bangladesh under the Interim Government (25 September 2024)



SIPG of NSU hosted a Policy Debate on the role and expectations of the interim government in Bangladesh on 25 September 2024 (Wednesday) at the university's Plaza area. The post-revolution political climate, including the difficulties and opportunities for change, were the discussion topics at the debate.

SIPG national seminar to disseminate the results of a national survey titled 'Citizens' Expectations from the Interim Government of Bangladesh' (02 October 2024)

SIPG of NSU organized a national seminar to disseminate the results of a national survey titled 'Citizens' Expectations from the Interim Government of Bangladesh' on 02 October 2024 at the National Press Club. The survey was conducted from September 9-19, 2024, in 17 districts of 8 country divisions. It is the first nationally representative survey conducted directly since the July Revolution. About 53 % of respondents think the current interim government's tenure should be two years or less, while 47% think that this interim government should stay in power for three years or more. The chief guest at the seminar was Dr. Badiul Alam Majumdar, Secretary, SHUJAN and Head, Electoral Reforms Commission. He said, "There is a contradiction to the trust and expectation that has emerged in the study. Fulfilling the commoner's expectations is this government's biggest Challenge."



SIPG Hosts Seminar on "Proposal for the Formation of a Police Commission and Other Reforms to Ensure Pro-People Policing Services" (9 November 2024)

SIPG of NSU organized a seminar on "Proposal for the Formation of a Police Commission and Other Reforms to Ensure Pro-People Policing Services" as part of its ongoing research initiatives addressing pressing national issues. The seminar focused on SIPG's recent position paper, developed in response to the needs identified in the aftermath of the July Revolution. It offered a comprehensive discussion on strategies for institutional police reform.

Brig. Gen. M. Sakhawat Hussain, PhD (Retd.), Honorable Adviser to the Ministry of Shipping and Ministry of Textiles and Jute of the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, attended the event as a special guest. The panel featured academics, scholars, representatives from various political parties, and senior government officials, bringing diverse views to the conversation.



Panel Discussion on Bangladesh's Democratic Resilience and the July Uprising of 2024 (13 November 2024)



SIPG of NSU took center stage in the national discourse on democratic resilience and resistance to autocracy with a timely panel discussion titled "Democratic Resilience and Breakdown of Autocracy in Bangladesh – The Case of the July Uprising in 2024." Professor Abdul Hannan Chowdhury, Vice-Chancellor of NSU, chaired the session. The panel discussion featured a distinguished panel, including Dr. Mubashar Hasan, Postdoctoral Researcher at the University of Oslo and Adjunct Fellow at the Humanitarian and Development Research Initiative (HADRI) at Western Sydney University; Professor Arild Engelsen Ruud, an expert on South Asian Studies from the University of Oslo; Munim Mubasshir, a student of NSU and member of the Anti-Corruption Reform Committee; and Musharrat Sharmee Hossain, Senior Lecturer in NSU's Department of English and Modern Languages. They explored the driving forces behind the July Uprising, assessing how grassroots democratic movements continue to reshape Bangladesh's political landscape. CPS Observes 7th Commemoration of Rohingya Genocide Day 2024 with International Webinar "Repairing the Harm: Restoring Justice for the Rohingya" (24 August 2024)



CPS of SIPG, NSU organized an international webinar on "Repairing the Harm: Restoring Justice for the Rohingya" to commemorate the 7th Rohingya Genocide Day on 24 August 2024 (Saturday) at 4:00 PM (BST) at the NSU campus. The webinar convened a diverse body of local scholars and international experts to engage in timely discussions on the ongoing need for justice, international accountability, sustainable peace, and restoration for the Rohingya community stranded in Bangladesh and excluded in Rakhine, Myanmar, and beyond. The event was live-streamed on the official Facebook page of CPS, attracting a transnational audience.

SIPG National Dialogue on "Working Towards a National Consensus on the Rohingya Policy of Bangladesh" (23 November 2024)

The importance of a national consensus and robust international support to resolve the protracted Rohingya crisis has been reiterated at a National Dialogue on Rohingya Policy organized by the SIPG of NSU. The National Dialogue titled "Working Towards a National Consensus on the Rohingya Policy of Bangladesh" took place at the Bangladesh Institute of International and Strategic Studies (BIISS) Auditorium in Dhaka and brought together a diverse range of stakeholders, including policymakers, academics, development partners, NGOs, media, and Rohingya leaders.



The inaugural session was graced by Lieutenant General (Retd.) Abdul Hafiz, Special Assistant to the Chief Adviser of the Government of Bangladesh, as the Chief Guest. Professor Sk. Tawfique M. Haque, Director of SIPG, delivered the opening remarks and contextualized the dialogue's significance. Following a keynote presentation, thought-provoking discussions led by special guests, including representatives from the United Nations and international agencies and speakers.

The second roundtable of the National Dialogue on Rohingya Policy Consensus brought together prominent speakers from various political parties and academic institutions. Key participants included Mr. Amir Khasru Mahmud Chowdhury, Ms. Shama Obaid from the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP), and Mr. AHM Hamidur Rahman Azad from Bangladesh Jamaat-e-Islami. Representatives from other political groups, including the Communist Party of Bangladesh (CPB), Bangladesh Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal, and the Ganosamhati Andolan.

Professor Abdul Hannan Chowdhury, PhD, Vice-Chancellor of North South University (NSU), emphasized the critical need for collaborative efforts to address the ongoing Rohingya crisis during the National Dialogue organized by SIPG.
